FACIALS SPECIALTY



This program is designed to teach students the latest techniques in the skin care industry and qualify students for employment while obtaining a Facial Specialty License from the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation. This content includes, but is not limited to the following:

- ▶ Communication, entrepreneurship, and employability skills
- ▶ Human relations and customer service
- Safe and efficient work practices
- ▶ Florida cosmetology law and rules
- Acquisition of knowledge of the facial skin and the related chemistry, infectious control, anatomy, and physiology
- Development of skill in performing facials, manipulation and related massage, make-up and eyelash application, and hair removal

Instruction and learning activities are provided in a laboratory setting using hands-on experiences with chemicals, implements, and equipment appropriate to the program's content and in accordance with safety and sanitation practices in the trade.
